All of the workshops will take place at **The Assembly House**, in the **Noverre Ballroom**.

Three Pillars of Jazz: Part I - The "I"

Saturday 10:00-12:00

Improvisation and the freedom to express yourself. Not just solo jazz, but how to move your body rhythmically, find the groove, and get comfortable dancing without a partner.

Three Pillars of Jazz: Part II - The "Us"

Saturday 14:45-16:45

Swing, coordination, and balance. Connecting the 'I' to the 'we'. Once you've found yourself, let's find a partner and connect through the music. In this class, we'll focus on one rhythm and learn how to play, explore and improve with it.

Sharing the Voice

The ultimate dancer can both speak and listen. In this class, we'll create balanced conversations where partners play off each other's creativity.

The Narthex

Cathedral of St John the Baptist, NR2 2PA


Friday night party

Located just a few minutes walk outside of the city centre, the Narthex is a part of the Cathedral of St John the Baptist.

The entrance is via Earlham road. Head up the steps near the main sign for the Cathedral and then go around to the right, through the car park, to find the Narthex.

There is free on-street parking not far away, and a bus stop right outside.

Also, note that we have two cathedrals in Norwich, so be sure to get the right one!





The Assembly House: Noverre Ballroom


Theatre Street, NR2 1RQ

Saturday & Sunday workshops, Saturday night party & Sunday afternoon party

The Assembly House is a beautiful Georgian building located right in the centre of Norwich, near the Theatre Royal.

The front entrance is via Theatre Street, and the back entrance is on Chantry Road.

Note that vehicle access may well be restricted on Saturday afternoon, but taxis will be able reach the venue via Chantry Road. For pedestrians, if Theatre street is busy, please use the rear door.






Chantry Hall

Saturday & Sunday taster classes & hangout space

Our regular venue for monthly tea dances, Chantry Hall is situated right next door to the Assembly House. The entrance is close to the Assembly House car park and the Chantry Place shopping centre.

Note that vehicle access may be restricted on Saturday afternoon, but taxis will be able to reach the venue via Chantry Road.

Saturday night afterparty

An easy 15min stroll across the city centre from the Assembly Rooms. Head upstairs in the pub to find our late night afterparty.

There is no parking at the venue - if you have travelled by car the closest public carparks are St Andrews multistorey carpark or St Helens Wharf Pay & Display carpark.



Lord Mayor's Weekend

Norwich is having its annual Lord Mayor's Weekend event on Saturday 13th and Sunday 14th July: https://www.norwich.gov.uk/lmw. It's a big street party so the city will be buzzing with people and lots of fun - this year the theme is 'Norwich Loves You'!

It's worth noting that there will be some temporary road closures, so be aware of the information below, especially if you're driving.

Activities will include:

- A fun fair, music and food stalls on Saturday in Chapelfield Gardens, just around the corner from our venues.
- A carnival parade through the city centre and up Theatre Street (in front of the Assembly House) between 2pm and 5pm on Saturday. The parade route and nearby roads may be closed or vehicle access restricted, and bus routes may be affected. If Theatre Street gets too busy to use the front entrance of the Assembly House you can enter via the rear door, which is on Chantry Road (navigate to 'Chantry Hall' on Google Maps).
- After the parade there is a party and concert in Chapelfield Gardens from 5pm until late evening. There are also bands playing on stages in the city centre.
- On Sunday things calm down but from 2:30pm there will be a rubber duck race along the river (a bit further away from our venues).

Getting around

Walking

Norwich is a nice city to walk around - we don't have many hills! If you're staying near the city centre then it should be easy to walk to all of the venues.

Cycling

Driving and parking

Driving is normally fairly straightforward in Norwich, but be aware that temporary road closures and extra traffic due to the Lord Mayor's will affect the city centre.

You won't be able to park directly at our venues, but there are several car parks near each one.

Buses

There are regular buses to Norwich city centre - for more information visit First Buses.

Taxis

We have a mixture of bookable taxis, and Hackney carriages that you can hail. The pre-booked taxis are on a fixed fee and usually a bit cheaper, and the Hackney carriages will charge you on a distance basis.

For bookable taxis <u>ABC Taxis</u> is the biggest taxi firm in the city. You can download their app to make booking easier. Others are available too, like <u>Courtesy</u> or <u>Goldstar</u>.

If you plan to get taxis at all then we recommend booking ahead of time if possible as they can get busy.

Food

We can't eat our own food at the Assembly House unfortunately, and prices in their restaurant are on the pricey side so most of us locals will be eating elsewhere... Fortunately though, Norwich city centre has a wide-range of food options, from supermarkets to delis, cafés and restaurants of all types, with lots of vegetarian and vegan options.

Here are some places that our lovely committee members recommend:

- The Bodega New York-style sandwich stall
- Bread Source artisan bakery and café
- Christophe's Crêpes for a sugar hit
- Norwich market a wide range of food stalls
- St. Benedicts Street & Pottergate lots of restaurants and cafés, set in the Norwich Lanes
- The Waffle House a Norwich staple featuring wafflebased savoury and sweet food
- Yalm foodhall with a selection of kitchens and bars
